3. Encourage, promote and educate to develop interest and awareness in smoke alarms, and the saving of lives through smoke alarms.
4. Advocating for continuous improvement of legislation, codes and standards.
5. Guidance and direction of industry best practice.
6. Provide advocacy to influence change and deliver improved fire safety outcomes for the community.
7. Develop and administer accreditation schemes that recognise the skills and knowledge of individuals providing services in the smoke alarm industry.
8. Assist any person, organisation or body whose objective it is to promote the benefits of and improve the methods of smoke alarm use and compliance.
9. Cooperate with Governments and authorities throughout Australia in promoting and developing strategies to save lives and property through smoke alarms.
10. Promoting smoke alarms as an integral part of a balanced fire protection solution.
11. Developing and delivering high quality training and educational programs.
12. Promoting legislation compliant installations.
13. Working with legislative bodies in the development of legislation.
14. Supporting competency for designers, technicians, electricians and testing personnel.
